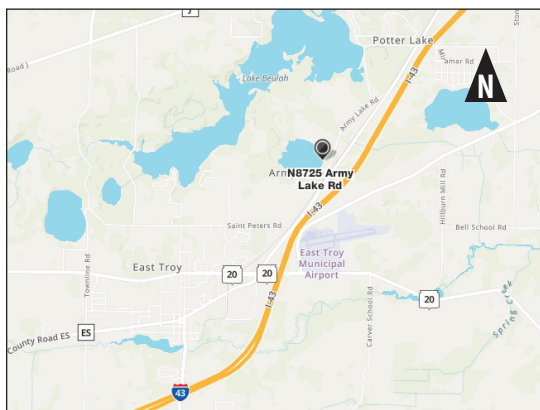

DIRECTIONS

From Milwaukee: From I-894 or US-41, merge onto I-43 S toward Beloit. Take the WI-20 exit, EXIT 38A, toward East Troy. Merge onto State Road 20/WI-20 toward East Troy. Turn right onto Main St./County Hwy ES. Continue to follow Hwy ES. Turn left onto Army Lake Rd.

From Madison: Take I-39 S/I-90 E toward Janesville/Chicago. Take the WI-59E exit, EXIT 163, toward Milton/UW-Whitewater. Turn left onto E County Road N which becomes County Hwy S. Turn right onto US-12/WI-89. Continue to follow US-12 E. Turn slight left onto State Road 20/WI-20 and follow for about 10 miles. Turn left onto Main St./County Hwy ES. Turn left onto Army Lake Rd.

Root and Butt Decays: Getting Down to the Bottom of It

– Glen Stanosz

 Root and butt decay fungi can have long-term impacts on tree health, but also are particularly important as causes of sudden total tree failure. The fungi in this very diverse group differ in the types of decay produced, aggressiveness, and appearance of fruiting structures. Learn symptoms and signs of some of the most common and important root and butt decay fungi, and the implications for trees, tree owners, and arborists.

Identifying & Serving Local Forest Products Markets

– Logan Wells & Scott Lyon
 This talk is about identifying and serving different types of forest product businesses in Wisconsin. An overview of the different industry sectors in the state followed by the specifications of the different raw materials those businesses are looking for will be the main discussion focus. Tailored to urban tree removals, we will go over a guide on how to identify different markets and utilize material for the highest and best use.

 This presentation will discuss inspections for aerial lifts/bucket trucks for use on a daily basis.

 Skyline is an alternative access to the tree for specific situations, especially when climbing the tree would be a risk due to its condition. This is especially true when the tree falls on top of the house due to storm damage or for whatever reason the tree failed and collapsed on the house.

 This presentation will cover the components of a trailering system, identifying load capacities, load distribution, and load securement.
