BMPs around Tree Roots - Ian Brown, Briana Frank

Tree roots commonly occupy the same spaces as other infrastructure within urban areas. Accounting for tree needs within the broader conversation of community, transportation, and building goals is necessary for achieving optimal outcomes. Not all trees are worth saving, but those that are should be are worth the additional effort. Justified removal and replacement of trees should be accompanied by improving site conditions prior to replanting.
